

# Angling Indiana – 2009 FISH CONSUMPTION ADVISORY

## Hendricks County- advice for sensitive populations\*

| East Fork of White Lick Creek                     | <a href="#">Creek Chub</a>         | 9+                   | 0  |
|   | <a href="#">Northern Hogsucker</a> | 11+                  | 0  |
|   | <a href="#">Yellow Bullhead</a>    | 10+                  | 0  |
| White Lick Creek                                  | <a href="#">Channel Catfish</a>    | 22+                  | 0  |
|   | <a href="#">Smallmouth Bass</a>    | 14+                  | 0  |

\*Sensitive populations include: pregnant or nursing women, women that will become pregnant, and children under 6 years of age. These consumers should use caution when eating some types of sportfish.

\*\*The maximum amount for adults to eat is determined by fishing location, species and fish length. For instance, if you eat the maximum amount of one species during a week, you should not eat any other fish which has a consumption limitation until the following week. Example - if you eat the limit (4 ounces) of a 20 inch long Carp from the Easy Catch River, then you should not eat any other sportfish from the list until the following week.
